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The Faculty of Science was initially established in 1975 with Law No. 1873 under the name Faculty of Science and Engineering Sciences, and its name was changed to the Faculty of Arts and Sciences in 1982. It continued its educational, instructional, and research activities under this name until 2022, when it was restructured as the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences by Presidential Decree No. 5868 dated 26/07/2022.

Who Are We?



The Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (FHSS) is a pioneering educational institution that analyzes the conditions created by the social, political, and economic transformations accompanied by the technological developments of humanity on earth in line with contemporary, humane, and ethical values, and interprets them according to the requirements of our age through its educational, instructional, scientific, cultural, and artistic activities, and contributes to science in national and international fields, providing solutions to the needs of society.

Our Faculty currently has 2,628 students studying under the supervision of qualified, young, and dynamic faculty members, including 24 Professors, 22 Associate Professors, 27 Assistant Professors, 29 Research Assistants, and 7 Instructors, making it one of the leading faculties of our University.

Currently, a total of two programs are accredited within the scope of FEDEK (The Association for Evaluation and Accreditation of University Programs in Mathematical, Natural and Social Sciences), and preparations for accreditation are ongoing for the remaining six programs.

We aim to graduate students capable of analytical thinking, research, and application, thanks to the education provided by our academic staff, who have proven themselves through national and international level research and publications. We strive to educate individuals who are competent in their field, able to demonstrate their expertise on international platforms and possess analytical thinking skills upon graduation.

As OMU-FHSS, our main goal is to educate individuals who possess a curious, entrepreneurial, and analytical mindset, who value tolerance, objectivity, and critical thinking. Our faculty strives to develop its curriculum, faculty, and technical infrastructure to create a dynamic and rapidly responsive structure instead of a static one in response to innovations and deepens its educational approach to create an active faculty structure.
