The School of Foreign Languages, the foundations of which were laid in 1997, provides preparatory education in English, German, French and Arabic. Preparatory education is offered to our students to make them proficient in a foreign language and equip them with the language skills that will contribute to their professional careers.

We have two associate professors, five assistant professors and 40 lecturers.

What About Our Qualifications and Academic Vision?

Our School, which sets out with the motto "Our future is on the wings of language", has young and dynamic academic staff. Our academists adopt the vision of improving our students' reading, speaking, writing, listening and comprehension skills in a foreign language. Our students are trained under the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. They are self-confident and intellectually equipped and can effectively use the language they learn in their social, academic and professional lives.

What Facilities and Opportunities Do We Offer?

Our School uses the up-to-date approaches in teaching world languages through its physical and technical opportunities. We have two language laboratories, one simulation laboratory and one library.

What Exchange Programs Do We Offer to Our Students? Our School supports Erasmus+, Farabi and Mevlana student exchange programs, and education opportunities are provided in partner countries and schools. Opportunities to improve language skills are provided through student exchange programs.
